You see, there is a long background of very important significance to a number of these early books and their early teachings which were in conflict with the truth brought to the Conference of 1888, and which we as a denomination had to repudiate because it was out of harmony with the Spirit of Prophecy, out of harmony with our later statement of faith of 1931, which is our standard teaching today, and with our teachings for decades. No opprobrium is to be attached to the few men who held the Arian view on Christ until the truth was brought before us at the 1888 conference. Then those who stubbornly clung to the early teaching came under the definite censure of the Spirit of Prophecy.
