Now, it is true that she [Mrs. White] uses terms like 'the divinity of Christ,' the 'eternal Word,' 'fountain of life,' and so forth. But these were being misconstrued and turned by those who held to a subordinate Christ, divine but not actually God in the eternal sense, for there was a time when He was not. Some abandoned the idea that He was a creature, but none gave Him the full equality with the Father. Now, they recognized that He was elevated to the place of Creatorship, and to the One who would bestow eternal life, or immortality. But theirs was a degraded Christ...

My point over in Berrien was to the effect that Mrs. White was not influenced by the strong men surrounding her.
