I thought possibly you might be interested in some of my recent correspondence, and I am therefore enclosing a copy of my letter to Brother Underwood on his recent pamphlet, "The Law and the Covenants," and also a copy of my letter to Brother Haskell.

I really think that something ought to be done to counteract the teachings which Brother Underwood is putting out. I find that the conference papers are recommending the pamphlet and vouching for it as orthodox.
