We have just received your telegram and are glad to learn of the favorable turn matters have taken. We judge that all that you planned will be carried out.

I have just arranged definitely to leave here on Wednesday at 9:50 P.M., taking the through tourist for San Francisco. This car is due in New Orleans Friday morning at 9:40 and in El Paso Sunday morning at 8:30. If you could arrange to join me at either one of these places, I should be very glad to have your company on the journey. I have already written you that there are no clergy rates via Chicago, and you may therefore find it to your advantage to take the Southern route.

The local campaign in behalf of the Sunday observance is growing in interest. Yesterday a large number of ministers preached upon the Sabbath, and while some made no reference to our work or to Sunday laws, others were quite ardent in their statements, and one minister referred to the Adventists by name, held up the leaflet which we have issued, and referred to it as "the system of the Devil."

The coming issue of THE WASHINGTON HERALD will feature a full and complete account of our protest, which was held up in the city.
