Dear Brother Daniells:

Since writing my other letter to you to-day, I have received a letter from Prof. Magan, with reference to the action of the Board of Trustees of Emmanuel College on the proposition of having Dr. Waggoner come to the institution next year. I enclose a copy of the letter which I have just written Dr. Waggoner bearing upon this matter, so that you can see how things stand.

I feel thoroughly disgusted at the course they have taken in this matter, and shall write them very plainly about it. If the thing is going this way, I shall not care to be connected with it. I have felt uneasy a good deal of the time, anyway, and think it best for the responsibility to rest upon those who are running the affairs of the institution.

I do not know just what to say further about the matter now, but thought that I ought to forward this information at the earliest possible moment.
