Dear Brother White,--

I have just received through the Foreign Mission Board an order from you on the International Tract Society Ltd. of London to the amount of five pounds, being a donation from your mother to our School Fund. In behalf of the Committee, I wish to acknowledge with thanks your mother's kind thoughtfulness and remembrance of our work. You will be interested to know that we have now about £250 in cash laid by toward this fund, and are receiving monthly remittances from our churches, a good proportion of whom are using the weekly system of collection in private missionary boxes for this purpose.

We have just closed a brief training school in which I had a class of ten to fifteen for about six weeks. The majority of them have received the truth during the last tent season, several having already been workers in connection with other churches. We expect to add several to our force this coming season as the result of this school work.

I wish also, in behalf of the International Tract Society Board, to express our thanks for your mother's kindness in donating to this field a set of plates for "Thoughts from the Mount of Blessing." I am sorry I have neglected for so long a time to make this acknowledgement. The Board passed a special vote of thanks at the time the donation was made and requested me to convey the same to the giver. Will you please do so now, adding my personal sense of appreciation of her kindness.

We are expecting to sail next wednesday on the S.S. Majestic, and shall probably reach Battle Creek about March 18th, so as to have a little time before the opening of the Conference. Dr. Waggoner and Dr. Ottosen will follow a week later on the Oceanic. We are hoping for a comfortable voyage, although the weather has been very rough all the winter. I hope you and all your family are well, and shall expect to see you at the Conference. With kind regards.
